UNIVERSITY OF OTTAWA

Need to apply to be a community partner, then enter project descriptions into a database. Projects may be linked to a course or completely independent. Students check the database and apply for things that interest them. They log their hours, which must be approved by you. When the project/work is finished, you fill in an evaluation form and the student does a brief

report on their experience. This process is rather intimidating at first, but the Ottawa U people who manage it are very helpful and accommodating.
